




# Physiotherapy = Physical Therapy

- Primary care practitioners who analyze, diagnose, treat and educate their clients to improve health





### Demand for Physiotherapy

- •14,300 new job openings (expansion, replacement).
- •14,100 new job seekers (graduation, immigration and mobility).

# Value of Physiotherapy






### Physiotherapy: Grounded in Movement Science

Physical therapists focus on disorders of movement and function.


Principles of care:

- Reasoned (life sciences)






# Physical Therapists provide health services across the lifespan and in a variety of settings

- Job prospects are good many students secure jobs prior to graduation







Our students engage in many social and fundraising events.






#### Interprofessional Education

#### Admission Requirements

- Must hold a 4-year baccalaureate degree (any discipline) from a college or university of acceptable standing
- Prerequisite classes: Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, Statistics
- Residency requirements: An applicant must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident AND be a resident of the Province of Saskatchewan, the Yukon, Northwest or Nunavut Territories




### Education Equity Program for Indigenous Students

The Master of Physical Therapy (MPT) academic program **maintains 8 Education Equity seats for Indigenous students** who meet the admissions requirements.








### Selection Process Used for Admissions

The overall admission score is calculated using:

- the Admission Average (weighted at 60%),
- the CASPer score (weighted at 32%), and
- The personal statement score (weighted at 8%)





### Admission Average

#### Minimum admission average = 75%

- Calculated using at least 60 credit units •
- Most recent credit units as of end of winter term 2025 (~April 30, 2025) Ó
- For the purpose of calculating the Admission Average, terms are not divided if only one  $\bullet$ course is needed to reach 60 credit units, all the courses in that term are taken
- New: A minimum 75% average is required on the pre-requisite coursework with a minimum grade of 70% on each pre-requisite course (Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, Statistics)







#### Expenses based on 2023/2024 academic year:


- Tuition: \$23,084.00 for the full program
- Graduate Student Fees: ~\$3,484 (includes Health/Dental, Transit, Student Wellness)
- Supplies: ~\$555
- Plus books

\*\* Clinical placements are a mandatory component of the program and <u>at least two</u> placements will occur outside of Saskatoon. Students must cover the costs of travel and accommodations for these placements (each placement is 5-6 weeks in duration).
